



SYNC AppLink: The free software program from Ford that gives SYNC users voice control of smartphone apps



SYNC AppLink is available on the 2012 Ford Fiesta, Fusion, Fusion Hybrid, F-150, Mustang, Expedition, E-Series, Super Duty, Shelby GT500 and SVT Raptor. For 2013 it is also available on the C-Max, Focus and Lincoln Navigator.

- AppLink is a standard no-charge feature of SYNC and the industry's only system that can control smartphone apps via voice control
- AppLink can access mobile apps on Android and BlackBerry smartphones using Bluetooth streaming and via a USB connection with Apple iPhone
- Pandora® internet radio, Stitcher news radio and OpenBeak for Twitter are the first SYNC-enabled apps available in the Apple App Store, Android Market and BlackBerry App World
